# Healy planning outdoor Sub-4

THE big talking point after last Sunday's Rathfarnam 5km Road Race, which attracted an entry of over 800, was the impressive fourth place performance by former Olympian Shane Healy, who finished as the top Master in the event.

Joe Sweeney of Dundrum South Dublin AC took an early lead on the downhill, first kilometre and coasted to a comfortable victory in 14 minutes 16 seconds. Sweeney, who plans on running a marathon next spring, finished second in the same event last year.

National Half-Marathon champion **Sean Hehir**, wearing the colours of the promoting club, chased Sweeney home for second spot in 14:50 and **Tommy Evans** (Gowran A.C) took third in 14:58.

Aoife Culhane made it a DSD double when winning the women's race in 16:41 from Annette Kealy (Raheny Shamrock AC) 16:50 and her club-mate Aoife Talty, who placed third in 16:54.

However, it was the spirited performance by Healy in 15:11 - just ahead of Donore's John Travers - that stood out on the day. It is over 13 years since Healy had put on a pair of training shoes. A semi-finalist at 1500 meters in the Atlanta Olympics of 1996, Healy only returned to running when his friend Dermot McDermott asked him to coach former European Junior 1500m Champion Colin Costello, who was planning a return to racing.

Back in 1996, Healy, who was coached by Eamonn Coghlan, ran 3:36.58 for 1500m in Madrid to qualify for the Atlanta Olympics. A year later he set a personal best of 3:35.29 in Brussels – a time that has seldom been bettered since by an Irish athlete.

Now Healy, who turns 43 next week, aims to be the first runner over 40 to break four minutes for the mile outdoors. Coghlan delivered his Sub-4 minute over-40 effort of 3:58.13 in an indoor race in the USA in 1994.

# Former Olympians show age is no barrier

IT was a weekend when former Olympians showed that age does not have to be a limiting factor, as in Ballyhaunis on Saturday where NOEL BERKELEY of DSD led the field home in the annual 8km road race - the final race in the Mayo AC Road League.

Berkeley, who competed in the Barcelona Olympics, travelled by motorbike from his home in Midleton in east Cork to compete in the event and finished in 25:54 to take the men's race ahead of ROGER BARRETT (Ballina AC), 25:56 and

MICHAEL CANTY (Ballina AC), 26:38. Another former Olympian, JERRY KIERNAN finished third in the over-50 Masters category in 31:10.

"I enjoyed the spin to the west as well as the race," Berkeley said.

There was a clean sweep for Mayo AC athletes in the women's race where MARY GLEESON notched up victory in 29:16. COLETTE TUOHY placed second in 30:49 and ANNE LENNON was third in 31:28. There was a big cheer too for 81-year-old local SEAN DOONER who finished the course in 59:15
